Recruitment Privacy Notice

1. Introduction

We respect the privacy rights of individuals and are committed to handling personal information responsibly and in accordance with applicable law. It is important that you read all of this Notice carefully as it sets out how we handle your personal information when you apply for a job or other role with us and the rights you have in connection with that information. The term "applicants" is used in this Notice to refer to anyone who applies for a job role, or who otherwise seeks to carry out work with or for us (whether on a permanent or non-permanent basis). If you are in any doubt, or have any comments or questions about this Notice, please contact us using the contact details set out at Section 9 below.

2. Types of personal information we collect when you apply

Information that we collect automatically

You can visit the recruitment section of our website <https://www.frc.org.uk/frc-for-you/careers> ("Website") and search for jobs without providing personal information. However, we do collect certain information automatically from your device when you visit our Website. Personal Information collected from you

The types of personal information we collect and process when you apply for a role with the FRC includes (but is not limited to):

- **Identification data and contact details** – including your name, address, email address, phone number and other contact information, gender, date of birth, nationality/ies, national identifiers (such as national ID/passport).
- **Employment history** – such as previous employers and job titles/positions.
- **Background information** – such as academic/professional qualifications, job qualifications, education, details included in your CV/résumé (which might include details of any memberships or interests constituting sensitive personal information), transcripts and employment references.
- Details of your **nominated referees** (including their name, contact details, employer and job role).
- Details of your **immigration/visa status**.
- **Previous applications/roles** (information relating to previous applications you have made to the FRC and/or any previous employment history with the FRC).
- **Other information you voluntarily provide** throughout the process, including through assessment centers / exercises and interviews/optional diversity information.
- **2 Personal information collected from other sources**
- **References provided by referees.**
- Information provided by **background checking agencies** and other external database holders (for example credit reference agencies and professional / other sanctions registries).
- Information provided by **recruitment or executive search agencies**. (in each case, where permissible and in accordance with applicable law).

3. Purposes for processing personal information

We collect and use this personal information primarily for recruitment purposes – in particular, to determine your qualifications for employment and to reach a hiring decision. This includes assessing your skills, qualifications and background for a particular role, verifying your information, carrying out reference checks or background checks (where applicable) and to generally manage the hiring process and communicate with you about it.

If you are accepted for a role at the FRC, the information collected during the recruitment process will form part of your ongoing staff member record and will be processed in accordance with our Staff Member Privacy Notice.

If you are not successful, we may still keep your application for six-twelve months to allow us to consider you for other suitable openings within the FRC in the future unless you request that we delete your application.

As a general rule, during the recruitment process, we try not to collect or process any of the following: information that reveals your racial or ethnic origin, religious, political or philosophical beliefs or trade union membership; genetic data; biometric data for the purposes of unique identification; or information concerning your health/sex life ("**Sensitive Personal Information**"), unless authorised by law or where necessary to comply with applicable laws.

However, in some circumstances, we may need to collect, or request on a voluntary disclosure basis, some Sensitive Personal Information for legitimate recruitment-related purposes: for example, information about your racial/ethnic origin, gender and disabilities for example for equal opportunities monitoring and anonymized reporting, to improve our recruitment processes, comply with anti-discrimination laws, for government reporting obligations or for benchmarking against diversity indexes for time to time; or information about your physical or mental condition to consider accommodations for the recruitment process and/or subsequent job role. You may provide, on a voluntary basis, other Sensitive Personal Information during the recruitment process.

4. Who we share your personal information with and transfers abroad

We take care to allow access to personal information only to those who require such access to perform their tasks and duties, and to third parties who have a legitimate purpose for accessing it. Where we report internally and externally on diversity statistics (e.g. sharing statistics with senior or hiring management or in our public reports or with our sponsoring government Department), this will be on a strictly anonymized basis, to help inform, achieve and report on transparency on diversity and inclusion across the organization. Whenever we permit a third party to access personal information, we will implement appropriate measures to ensure the information is used in a manner consistent with this Notice and that the security and confidentiality of the information is maintained.

Transfers to third party service providers

We may make certain personal information available to third parties who provide services relating to the recruitment process to us, including:

- recruitment or executive search agencies involved in your recruitment;
- background checking or other screening providers and relevant local criminal records checking agencies;
- data storage, shared services and recruitment platform providers, IT developers and support providers and providers of hosting services in relation to our careers website; and

- third parties who provide support and advice including in relation to legal, financial / audit, management consultancy, insurance, health and safety, security and intel and whistleblowing / reporting issues.

We may also disclose personal information to third parties on other lawful grounds, including:

- Where you have provided your consent;
- To comply with our legal obligations, including where necessary to abide by law, regulation or contract, or to respond to a court order, administrative or judicial process, including, but not limited to, a subpoena, government audit or search warrant;
- In response to lawful requests by public authorities (including for tax, immigration, health and safety, national security or law enforcement purposes);
- As necessary to establish, exercise or defend against potential, threatened or actual legal claims;
- Where necessary to protect your vital interests or those of another person; and/or
- In connection with the sale, assignment or other transfer of all or part of our business. In some cases, the sharing described above may result in your personal information being transferred internationally. These countries may have data protection laws that are different to the laws of your country (and, in some cases, may not be as protective). Our third party service providers may operate outside of the UK and so we may process it abroad but will only do so where we have taken appropriate and legally compliant safeguards to require that your personal information will remain protected in accordance with this Notice.

5. Legal basis for processing personal information

Under UK data protection law, our legal basis for processing your personal information as part of the recruitment process is:

- our legitimate interests (as summarised above in Section 3) (which are not overridden by your data protection interests or fundamental rights and freedoms, particularly taking into consideration the safeguards that we put in place, for example, those outlined in Section 4 above);
- to comply with applicable immigration and/or employment laws and regulations;
- to take steps prior to entering an employment contract with you, where you are considered for employment;
- in circumstances where you have made the data public;
- where we have your consent to do so. Where we have requested your consent to process your personal data, you have the right to withdraw your consent at any time;
- to protect the rights and interests of the FRC, our employees, applicants and others, as required and permitted by applicable law.

If we ask you to provide personal information to comply with a legal requirement or to perform a contract with you, we will make this clear at the relevant time and advise you whether the provision of your personal information is mandatory or not (as well as of the possible consequences if you do not provide your personal information). If you have questions about or need further information concerning the legal basis on which we collect and use your personal information, please contact us using the contact details provided in Section 9 below.

6. Data retention periods

Personal information will be stored in accordance with applicable laws and kept as long as needed to carry out the purposes described in this Notice or as otherwise required by applicable law. Generally this means your personal information will be retained:

- in accordance with the retention periods explained further in the FRC's Staff Member Privacy Notice (where you become our employee) and which is available upon request; or
- for a period of six – twelve months after confirmation that your application was unsuccessful unless you request that we delete your application.

7. Your data privacy rights

You may exercise the rights available to you under applicable data protection laws as follows:

- If you wish to access, correct, update or request deletion of your personal information, you can do so at any time by contacting us using the contact details provided below.
- You can object to processing of your personal information, ask us to restrict processing of your personal information or request portability of your personal information. Again, you can exercise these rights by contacting us using the contact details provided below.
- If we have collected and process your personal information with your consent, then you can withdraw your consent at any time. Withdrawing your consent will not affect the lawfulness of any processing we conducted prior to your withdrawal, nor will it affect processing of your personal information conducted in reliance on lawful processing grounds other than consent.
- You have the right to complain to a data protection authority about our collection and use of your personal information. For more information, please contact your local data protection authority. We respond to all requests we receive from individuals wishing to exercise their data protection rights in accordance with applicable data protection laws.
